Rock Garden Charter

accepted on 2/7/2012

I. Vision

- 1. We are a **community** of people choosing to support our common values and spend our lives together with those we love, as a tribe.
- 2. We **value** real sustainability, honesty, clear communication, a safe and healthy natural environment, an empowered work ethic, communal responsibility, respect, justice, sharing, love and fun.
- 3. We are choosing to intentionally and consciously create a **culture** expressing our values to create a better world directly and through our example.
- 4. We are creating and maintaining a sustainable and diverse infrastructure to provide materially and emotionally for ourselves and future generations, honoring those with whom we are interdependent.

II. Governance

- 1. Our decision-making body is a weekly open **Council**.
 - a. Decisions are made by a consensus of the partnership in attendance.
 - b. Absent partners will be contacted when possible, in regard to major decision.
 - c. If the partnership has reached consensus minus only one partner, the decision can be passed with consensus minus one of the entire Council.
 - d. It is the responsibility of the interested party to present his or her agenda in a forthright manner to the Council.
 - e. It is the responsibility of all present on the land to attend Council regularly.
 - f. We understand that all will miss Council occasionally and agree not to do so for reasons of avoidance or manipulation.
 - g. We specifically welcome our neighbors to participate in our council.
 - h. We carefully consider situational exceptions to our agreements.

III. Membership

- When referenced in this charter, membership consists of partners, pilgrims, and currently-residing players. Everyone present in our home, however, is responsible to abide by all our community agreements.
- 2. We are open to **visitors**.
 - a. Visitors are required to submit our visitor questionnaire prior to arrival.
 - b. All visitors and the dates of their visit are agreed to, and an advocate, rotating bi-monthly, is agreed to.
 - c. Those that happen to be here without prior approval can be asked to leave, or be allowed to submit the questionnaire and find an advocate at their first Council.
 - d. Visitors are welcome to petition the Council for an extension of their visit.
 - e. When the agreed-upon visit ends, visitors are required to leave.

- 3. Those that are known and invited by one of our members are known as **guests**.
 - a. Guest stays should have prior approval and require an advocate.
 - b. If staying longer than expected, guests shall be treated as visitors.
- 4. Those who have been successful visitors may, in their absence, request to return as **players**.
 - a. Applicants will be reviewed in Council.
 - b. Players can visit for extended periods, coming and going without pre-approval.
 - c. Monthly reviews and rotating advocacy is required for all players while present.
 - d. Players are allowed to introduce visitors and guests, advocating for them only initially.
- 5. We are open to **pilgrims** who wish to join our partnership.
 - a. At least six months of resident participation as a player, a statement of intention to become a partner, a personal review by feather, and consensus of the partners are required for pilgrim-ship.
 - b. Pilgrims may advocate for visitors, guests, and players.
 - c. Pilgrims are reviewed bi-annually and their status is confirmed by the panel.
 - d. At least one year of successful pilgrim-ship and consensus of the partners are required for partnership.
- 6. We do establish a **partnership** committed to the vision and manifestation of this community.
 - a. Our partners agree to be leaders, *fully* engaged in the creation of this generational home and in their own self-care, becoming a people indigenous to this place.
 - b. Partners may advocate for visitors, guests, and players.
 - c. Partners are responsible annually for initiation of a personal review and discussion.
 - d. The partnership together is responsible for developing and annually reviewing the plans of this community.
 - e. The status of a partner may be changed by two consecutive consensuses of the partners minus one.
